They are expected to have the vision to contribute to the entire AO VET organization and to help us set new standards and position AO VET as a global leader in musculoskeletal veterinary surgery. AO VET is now seeking nominations and reapplications for the following position:
Position available	A member of the AO VET Asia Pacific (AP) Board with a particular focus on education for a 3-year term (open to small animal surgeons); this role will act also as a member of the AO VET Education Commission According to our terms of reference, and in order to properly reflect the cultural diversity of the region, not more than two Board members are permitted from the same country (as determined by place of work rather than nationality), unless there are exceptional circumstances. This includes the Chair of the Board.

¹ Current Board members can apply for one more term in case they are in their first term. Any re-election shall follow the same procedure and rules as a regular election. If the person nominated for re-election is the only candidate, a 75% majority vote by the overall electorate is required. Both terms must be back-to-back without intervening time off.
